Marine Surveyor Average Wage Scale.

The pay scales denoted below are average salaries calculated from data provided by a range of different employers. Pay rates may be greater or less and are dependent on the type of surveys undertaken, location and employer.

An entry-level Marine Surveyor with no previous surveying background or qualifications can expect a salary of \$40K as a trainee. Generally, all costs for training are paid for by the employer.

A qualified surveyor with less than 5 years of experience can expect to earn an average total compensation of AU\$77,000 - \$80,000 (inclusive of Superannuation) based on average salary data provided. Average total compensation includes may include additional overtime payments however this is negotiated directly with the employer.

A qualified Marine Surveyor with mid-career experience of 5 to 10 years of experience can expect to earn an average total compensation of AU\$86,000 - \$90,000 based on average salaries.

A qualified and career experienced Marine Surveyor with 10 to 20 years of experience can expect to earn an average total compensation of AU\$113,000 - \$120,000 – bonus's and overtime payments are usually on top of this salary

A Marine Surveyor with late-career experience with specialisations and greater than 20 years of experience can expect to earn an average total compensation of AU\$130,000 - \$160,000.
